INTRODUCTION:

Mangalore University was established on September 10, 1980 to cater to the higher educational needs of Dakshina Kannada, Udupi and Kodagu Districts. The University Campus is situated in a picturesque location and is a major centre for advanced academic studies and research.

Mangalagangothri campus is located at a distance of about 20 Km south-east of the city of Mangalore. It is spread over an area of about 350 acres and is on a high elevation overlooking the Arabian Sea on the one side and the Western Ghats on the other. Since its establishment, the University has made considerable progress in the field of higher education and research.

Although Mangalore University is one of the youngest Universities in the country, it has within its ambit some of the oldest and prestigious institutions of higher learning. There are 28 Post Graduate departments in the University Campus offering 40 Post Graduate programmes, Along with Post Graduate Diplomas in Yogic Science as also Embedded Systems and some short term programmes in Yogic Science.

There are 12 Post Graduate programmes on offer at Jnana Kaveri Campus at Chikka Aluvara, in Kodagu District. A Post Graduate Diploma programme in Yogic Science, Certificate and Diploma programmes in Kodava are also being offered here.

University College, Mangaluru offers six Post Graduate programmes along with a one year Post Graduate Diploma and three month certificate programme in Yogic Science.

In the University Evening College at Mangaluru, five Post Graduate programmes, as also Certificate and Diploma programmes in French and German languages are being offered.

Field Marshal K.M. Cariappa College, Madikeri offers five Post Graduate programmes, a Post Graduate Diploma programme in Yogic Science, as also Diploma and Certificate Programmes in Kodava.

The campus has hostel facilities for both men and women. The central facilities on the campus include a well-equipped Library; a Computer Centre; world class science

laboratories such as CARRT, CARER, PURSE and Microtron Centre; University Science Instrumentation Centre, Health Centre, Directorates of Student Welfare and of Physical Education, Yakshagana Kala Kendra, several seminar halls, Mangala Auditorium and a Multi Gym. A Day Care Centre, Vishwamangala English Medium School with Pre-primary, Primary and High school classes, a Pre-University College, and University First Grade College have been in operation successfully. University First Grade Colleges at Nelyadi and Moodbidri were established during the academic year 2018-19 and 2021-22 respectively. A shopping complex and the University Employees Co-operative Society are located on the campus. There are two well-furnished Guest houses, two Canteens, two Banks, and a Post Office on the campus. Transportation and other modern communication facilities are also available for the benefit of students. The Campus also has good facilities for sports and games.

Besides sports, short-term programmes for staff and students in Yoga are frequently conducted by the University. Lectures, workshops and training programmes are organized under different endowment chairs. Co-curricular and extracurricular cultural activities reflecting the multicultural ambience of the region are conducted on the campus. The Prasaranga unit is engaged in the dissemination of knowledge and separate cells to cater to the needs of OBC and SC/ST students are available. The campus has a large footprint of international students from different countries. There are Counsellors for the benefit of both staff and students.

HOW TO REACH MANGALORE UNIVERSITY CAMPUS, MANGALAGANGOTTHRI:

Mangalore University Campus, Mangalagangothri is located about 18 Kilometres from Mangalore Railway Station/Mangalore City/KSRTC Bus Stand (Bejai). The Service Bus Stop at State Bank Circle is within one km from the Mangalore Central Railway Station.

To reach Mangalore University campus, board the city buses (Route No. 51, 51A, 51E, 55). If you have travelled by train and alighted at Mangalore Junction Railway Station, you can travel to Pumpwell Circle Bus Stop by Auto and board the buses with the above route numbers to reach the campus.

Alternatively, shuttle buses travelling from Mangalore towards BC Road/Vittla via Konaje also have a stop at Mangalore University and can be boarded at State Bank Circle, Jyothi Circle and Pumpwell Circle Bus Stops. The KSRTC buses (Route No. 51, 51A, 51K) starting from KSRTC bus stand and travelling towards Mudipu also stop at Mangalore University and travel via Jyothi Circle.

Route to Mangalore University Campus, Mangalagangothri:

State Bank circle/KSRTC Bus Stand→Jyothi→Pumpwell→Thokkottu→ Deralakatte→ Mangalagangothri.

If you travel by private vehicle, the campus is about 30 minutes' drive from Mangalore City.

DIRECTORATE OF STUDENT WELFARE:

MANGALORE UNIVERSITY LIBRARY:

Mangalore University has a spacious library with about 2,00,000 books, about 23,000 back volumes, reports, theses, etc. covering a wide variety of subjects. It has a good collection of about 270 research and general interest journals on a wide range of subjects. It has access to over 7500 journals in Full Text from UGC-INFONET. Besides this, Audio-visual facility, Computer Aided Retrieval, CD-ROM Work Station and Reprographic Service (Xerox) are available in the Library. Cyber lab with 50 stations is available for accessing e-journals.

The Library has different sections for Browsing, Circulation, Periodicals, Reference, Stack, Textbooks and Literature Sections. The building also houses an Office, Acquisition Section, Technical Section, Orientation Hall and Librarian's room. Separate collections of NBHM, USIS, Pavanje Chair photo gallery and Shastri Indo-Canadian Institute's Publications are displayed in different corners of the Stack and Periodical Sections. Display panels in both the gangways furnish information on various current information services like Admissions, Appointments, Book Reviews, Do You Know, Faculty Publications, Fellowships, Orientation and Refresher Course details and Today's News .

Borrowing privileges:

Smart cards are issued to the users of our library. PG students can borrow three books (Six books for SC/ST students) at a time for a period of 15 days. Professors and Associate Professors can borrow 25, Assistant Professors 15, Research Scholars (Regular) 10, Research Scholars (part time) 2, Guest faculty 5, and office staff 2 books at a time. A Fine is to be paid on books returned after the due date at a rupee per day.

CANTEENS:

There is a centrally located canteen on the University campus, between the science block and the engineering section which caters to the needs of students, faculty and the general public. A Canteen is also available in the Administrative Building.

UNIVERSITY HEALTH CENTRE:

The health centre on the campus takes care of the medical needs of students, staff members and officials of the University. Attached to it are a Dental Clinic and Pathology Lab. The Centre provides regular and emergency treatment to the patients.

Services available:

- Outpatient consultation and treatment
- Free blood and urine investigation
- Free service to all the students, teaching staff, Non-teaching staff and to their dependents.
- Laboratory investigation done for all necessary cases.
- A preliminary health check-up of all students of University Hostels is done at the beginning of academic year. Height, weight, Blood group and haemoglobin check-up is done and if necessary treatment is advised.
- A Dental unit run by K S Hegde Dental College, Deralakatte has been set up at the Health Centre where basic dental treatment is provided to patients for nominal charges.
- In case of emergency and severe health problems the patients are referred to recognized hospitals for further treatment and medical reimbursement facilities are provided to all the permanent employees of the University.

COMPUTER CENTRE:

Computer Centre (established 1990) plays a key role in today's knowledge driven society. It provides comprehensive Information Communication technology (ICT) services to Academic/Administrative departments of the university. Its key services includes providing reliable and available ICT infrastructure comprising of computational services and Internet services. Computer Centre maintains reasonably good ICT environment and augments the same from time to time as and when needed. It is also geared up to provide uninterrupted IT services to the end users. The following facilities are available:

Computational Facilities:

Computer Centre houses mail server and web servers, to provide ICT services. These servers are connected to clients in cyber lab and other PG Departments/offices/centres. Campus network on OFC interconnects all computers systems in one logical network facilitating services to be utilized from any server on the network. Central servers and network services are available round the clock on 24x7 basis.

Cyber Lab Facility:

Cyber lab is the facility made available to all users. It houses 40 desktop systems with internet connectivity. It also has adequate peripherals such as printers, scanners. Cyber lab is operational from 10.00 AM to 5.30 PM on all working days.

New Central Computer Lab:

A central computer lab facility was established during January 2021. The lab contains 80 desktops of various configuration which can be used for the research, lab practical and web browsing. This Lab is now the major central computer lab available for all the departments of the university. Central computer lab is operational from 10.00 AM to 5.30 PM on all working days.

E-mail Facility:

Computer Centre hosts in-house mail server with domain mail.mangaloreuniversity.ac.in. Web based mail services are available on independent server with open source mailing solution.

Web portal:

Maintenance of university website - www.mangaloreuniversity.ac.in is done by updating the contents from time to time.

Internet facility:

Internet communication is the lifeline in todays connected digital world. University provides Internet facility through two services providers viz NKN and i-On. This ensures secure and safe internet experience to all users. Internet access is available at all departments/offices round the clock on 24X7 basis.

Wi-Fi Facility:

Security is the major concern in Wi-Fi usage. Adequate security – both for connectivity to Wi-Fi network and to the data transferred over the air has been ensured. The user is allowed to access only through the registered mobile device, where MAC id of the device shall be the identifying feature. Additionally, the users have to authenticate themselves using the user name and password assigned to him /her.

CCTV Surveillance System:

Closed-circuit television (CCTV) also known as video surveillance, is the use of video cameras to transmit a signal to a specific place, on a limited set of monitors. There are totally 147 cameras of different types installed in the Campus, covering most of the area of the University. An expert engineer is available in the campus for maintaining the setup.

SPECIAL CELL FOR SC/ST:

A special Cell for the welfare of students, belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes in Mangalore University was established for effective implementation of the programmes and policies of reservation. SC/ST research fellowships and contingency grants are sanctioned to Ph.D. students. It also extends financial assistance to various programmes such as study tour, preparation of dissertation/project reports, purchase of sports kits and computer training. Training programmes for the SC/ST students appearing for UGC/JRF/Lectureship examinations, facilities awareness programmes, career guidance and personality development programmes are also conducted. A database of the SC/ST students studying in the affiliated colleges of Mangalore University and Post Graduate departments of Mangalore University is maintained in the SC/ST Cell.

SC/ST cell is in charge of scholarships, EBL charges of the hostel inmates and reimbursement of fees from the Government for SC/ ST students studying in the P.G. departments. It also functions as a grievance redressal cell for the SC/ST students.

SPARSH:

The University has constituted a separate cell SPARSH (Sensitization, Prevention and Redressal of Sexual Harassment) to combat sexual harassment in the University. Awareness of the existence of the cell is created by displaying pamphlets on the notice boards of the departments, offices of the University and other central facilities. Lectures, Workshops are conducted for students, research scholars, teaching and nonteaching staff of the campus. Various events are also held to create awareness about sexual harassment in the workplace and the possible means of redress. The committee consists of the chairperson, a non-teaching woman representative, a SC/ST woman representative, teacher representatives, female faculty members, research scholars, student representatives, a NGO representative and a legal advisor. There is also an Internal Complaints Committee - ICC consisting of four members, namely, the chairperson, two female faculty and a legal advisor, which looks into the complaints that come to SPARSH.

DIRECTOR OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION/ SPORTS FACILITIES:

A separate Directorate of Physical Education looks after the sports activities in the campus and University. The campus has 400 Mts. Standard track, Football, Hockey, Cricket fields, Kho-Kho, Kabaddi, Basketball, Tennis, Handball and other playgrounds. The university has an Indoor Sports Complex on par with international standards with a Fitness Centre and an airconditioned conference hall. The sports complex also has facilities for Table Tennis, Wrestling, Gymnastics and other Indoor games. The university has formulated a unique sports policy. There is a separate P.G Department in Physical Education offering B.P Ed, M. P Ed and research programmes.

The Directorate conducts a number of inter-collegiate, inter-university programs, coaching camps and campus sports, besides 51 inter-collegiate sports programs every year. Out of these, 25 events are conducted for men and 26 events are conducted for women including rural women's sports and Folk and traditional games. Cash prizes are given to the students who create new records in the inter-collegiate tournaments to encourage the sportspersons.

Incentives:

- Scholarship of Rs.1500/- per month for upcoming sports persons.
- Two to three lakh Rupees special scholarship will be given to the outstanding sports persons every year.
- Inter-University medallist will be honoured every year; winners are rewarded with cash prizes, of 15,000 to 30,000 rupees a pair of shoes, blazer and trophies by the University.
- We give Financial Assistance for participation in inter-national events. In 2019-2020 we spent Rs.21 lakhs on 10 athletes to participate in the World University games held at Italy.
- One seat is reserved in each Post Graduate Department of the University for high achieving sports persons.
- Mangalore University is the first University to introduce Re-Examination to help the sports persons who may be unable to take the regular examination because of their participation in University, national & international competitions.
- For the safety of our sports persons, we have introduced insurance policy to cover injured sports persons during camp or competition.
